

Daily Legislative Update

Tuesday, March 20, 2018

Governor Holcomb has officially announced he will be calling the Indiana General Assembly back to the State House for a Special Session in May.

The governor has the power to call a special session of the General Assembly at any time if, in his or her opinion, the public welfare shall require such a session. Duration of the special session is limited to 30 session days during a period of 40 calendar days.

A special session has been estimated to cost Indiana taxpayers \$30,000 a day for such a session. Don't anticipate the legislative chambers convening until agreement has been reached and business can be completed in a couple days.
